There were no speakers at the first opportunity for public comments.

He also mentioned that he and Board Member Jim Weidman met with Ellen about the partnership with Advocate. - Board Member **Tom Meskel** also mentioned the Science Olympiad competition - 25 schools participated and he said that the new PA system worked very well. He also mentioned attending the Meadowview School Woodland Day and explained how the students made presentations about trees, and other interesting nature subjects. He said it was very enjoyable.
- Board Member **David Northern** mentioned that he still helps out with the Park Campus PTO on occasion and volunteered as the DJ for the Valentine Dance at Park. He also mentioned that there is a lot going on in the county - that Lake County is doing a good job trying to help eliminate issues that are going on since the last election. He mentioned an event on February 21 - the Inclusive Community Summit for Lake County leaders.
- Board Member **Kathleen Parkinson** mentioned how nice it was to see the GMS Jazz Band playing at the Science Olympiad competition. She also mentioned the Advocate partnership and wanted to make sure when the mobile unit comes to the schools and events that families aren't singled out and that there are benefits to all to be more inclusive. She also mentioned that there are some businesses that are interested in working with the district on gardening initiatives.
- Board Member **Stephen Mack** also mentioned the Advocate partnership and said it seems like a very exciting partnership with opportunities to create a wide range of healthy community programs and partnerships. There is a lot of fascinating information and potential out there.
- Board Member **Jill Alfrejd** asked about the possibility of videotaping the committee meetings to post on the website. Update on Board/District Beliefs and Goals

The board members suggested some changes in wording.

Update on Food Service Bids

The Preferred Meals presentation did not go the way the board expected. They were hoping to see other options available. A suggestion was made to put out a survey to parents and possibly students. Mr. Chris Bobek, Assistant

Superintendent of Business and Finance, said there is still time to look at other vendors or go out to bid. He said his priority is to make sure we are reaching the students who need the lunches, not necessarily the students who normally bring lunches. We need to make sure that the students who need lunch have lunch and that they want to eat them. Mr. Bobek put together some options on what the cost options look like based on a certain participation rate. Board Member David Northern is concerned about pricing out some of the families. A suggestion was made to look into what the high school district is doing and see if perhaps we can partner with them. Mr. Northern also asked if there is a school food consultant that we can work with that may be able to assist us. Board President Steven Strack instructed Mr. Bobek to go ahead and go out to bid while we keep researching the issue.

New Business:

Discussion of District Priorities

Superintendent Correll presented the Strategic Plan priorities and mentioned that we have accomplished one of them - the air conditioning at Meadowview and Woodview Schools. The Board is looking at the list of other priorities. Assistant Superintendent Chris Bobek discussed the financial outlook for the district. The priorities discussed were all-day kindergarten, added encore programming, one-to-one technology, Project Lead-the-Way (NGSS/STEM program), and reduced class size. At this time the Board was able to select four of the priorities that they want to investigate for the future. This is a "best case" scenario of what they would want to implement if they could implement any of them.

The priorities came out as:

One-to-One Technology: 7

Foreign Language: 7

Added Encore: 6

Full Day Kindergarten: 6

Class size reduction: 1

Project Lead-the-Way: 0

Gifted & Talented: 0

Based on this outcome the board asked to have a lead-time assessment done on each of these and presented to the Board.

There were no comments at the second public comment session.
